

When I received a Federal grant at the beginning of 1974 to develop my privately owned ballet company, it was the beginning of the realisation of an ambition for this State to have a permanent, full time ballet company of its own.

Twelve years' foundation work were behind this ambition, but the realisation would not have been possible without the help of a great many people over a number of years.

Tasmania now has its own Ballet Company — it is the only regional dance company in Australia resident outside a capital city, but it belongs to the whole State. Tasmania should be pleased with its Company and its dancers — they work well and constructively, and their work is important.

The Tasmanian Ballet is no longer my company. I have never regretted returning to my home State and in particular have been pleased to hand over the Company to the State as from January 1975. I must thank the Premier and the Minister for the Arts for their support and for granting to us the title Tasmanian State Ballet Company.

In my work I continue to see young children of promise just beginning their training in this State and I believe that in these children lies Tasmania's ballet future.
